Timothy F. Geithner was the 75th Secretary of the Treasury for the first term of President Barack Obama's administration. He was a principal architect of the president's successful strategy to avert economic collapse and to reform the financial system. Between 2003 and 2009, Mr. Geithner served as President and Chief Executive Officer of the Federal Reserve Bank of New York. He first joined the Treasury Department as a civil servant in 1988 and held a number of positions in three administrations, including Undersecretary for International Affairs under Secretaries Robert Rubin and Lawrence Summers. Mr. Geithner is the author of STRESS TEST: Reflections on Financial Crises. He is a Lecturer at the Yale School of Management and a member of the Board of Directors of the International Rescue Committee. Mr. Geithner is currently President of Warburg Pincus, a global private equity firm.
